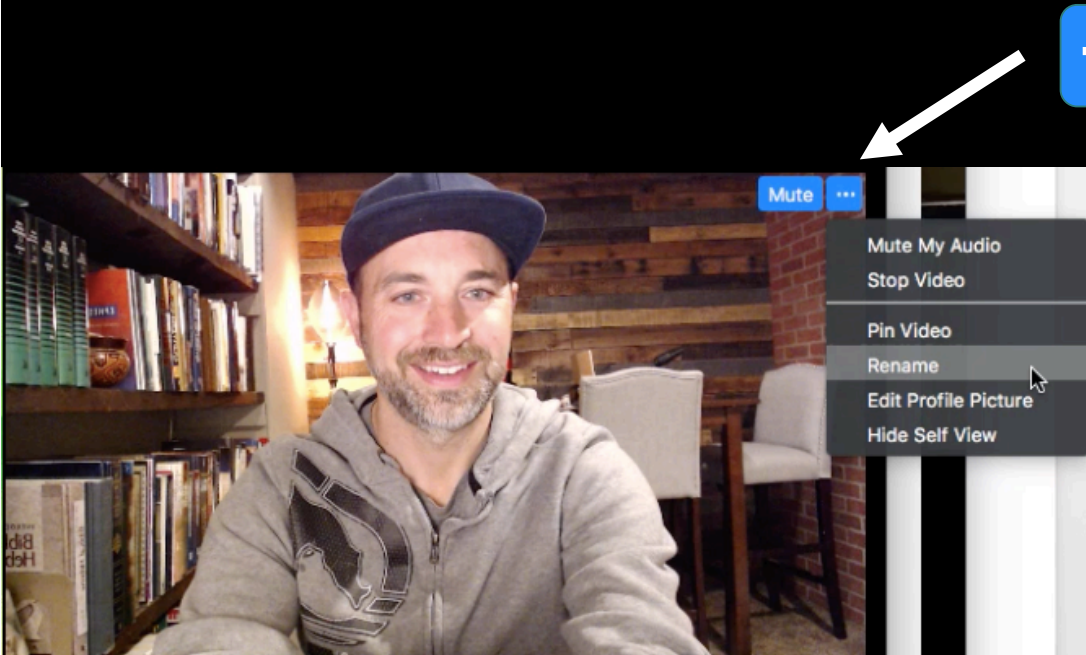

Why Relaunch Your Church?



Five Reasons to Relaunch Your Church?

1. The opportunity is unprecedented.

“The harvest is plentiful..” (Luke 10:2)

“Don’t you have a saying, ‘It’s still four months until harvest’?

I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields!

They are ripe for harvest” (John 4:35).

Five Reasons to Relaunch Your Church?

2. The timing is perfect for revisiting your vision and values

Vision is not something dreamed up! But it is something revealed by God.

Vision is fulfilling the marching orders of Jesus.

Matthew 28:16-20; Mark 16:15; Luke 24:45-49

John 20:21; Acts 1:8

Five Reasons to Relaunch Your Church?

3. This season is an opportune time for investing in key leaders.

“The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out Workers into his harvest field” (Luke 10:2).

“And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others” (2 Timothy 2:2).

Five Reasons to Relaunch Your Church?

4. The moment is right for creating new momentum.

“As God’s co-workers we urge you not to receive God’s grace in vain.

For he says, “In the time of my favor I heard you,
and in the day of salvation I helped you.”

I tell you, now is the time of God’s favor, now is the day
of salvation”

(2 Corinthians 6:1-2).

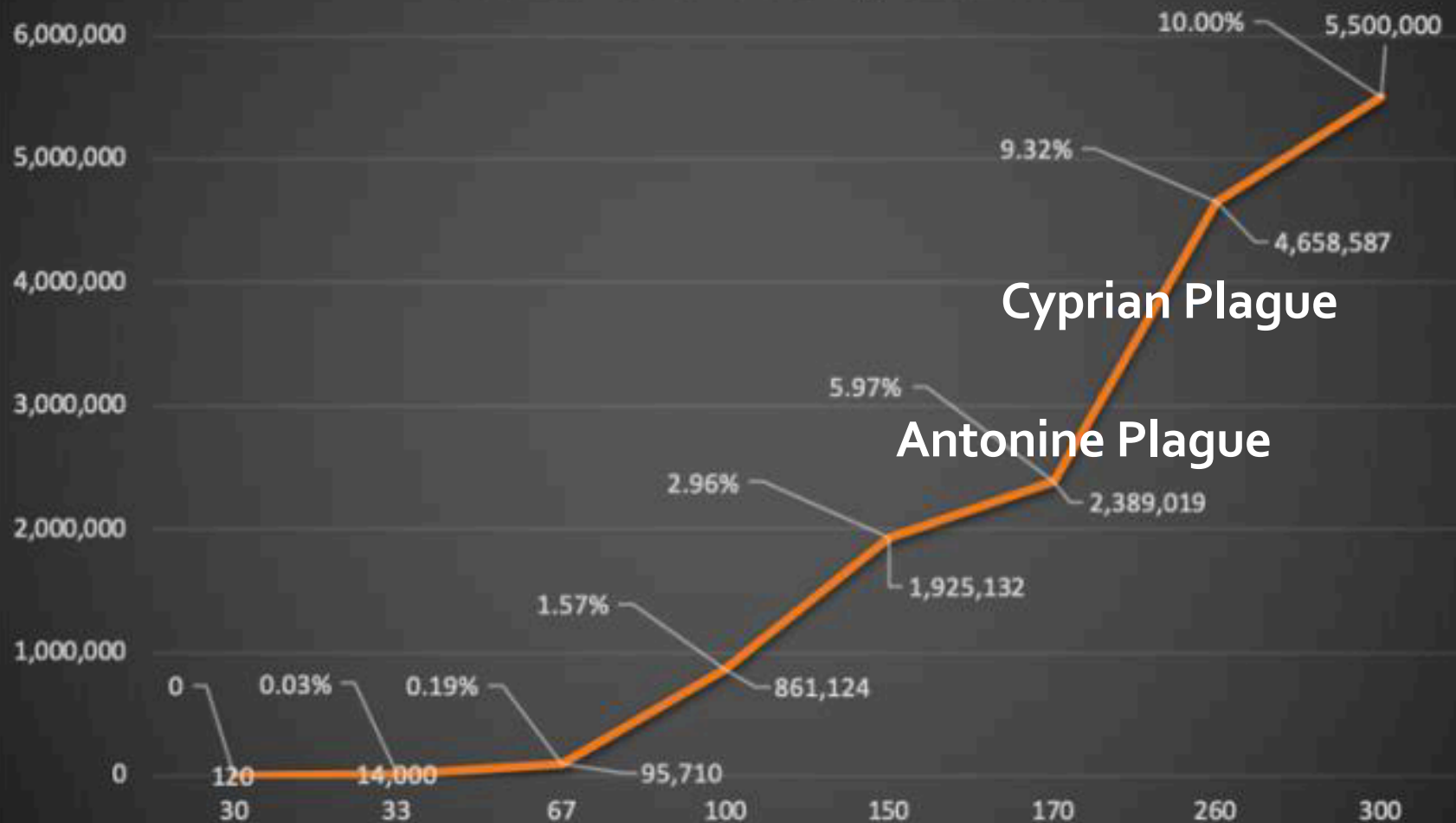
Five Reasons to Relaunch Your Church?

authorities, to be obedient,
to be ready to do whatever is good,
to slander no one, to be peaceable and considerate,
and always to be gentle toward everyone” (Titus 3:1-2).

Growth of the Early Church



Lessons from the early church leaders

- They knew God was on mission.
- They kept the church on mission.
- They did not complicate the mission.
- They equipped and empowered people to make the gospel attractive to others.
- They focused on attracting people to Christ not the worship service.
- The growth trajectory of the church was never flattened.
