VISION UPDATE

Another Antioch Moment

We have faced many Antioch Moments in the life of Converge MidAmerica.

What is an Antioch Moment? We find this principle in Acts 13:1-3, where we discover the leaders of the church in Antioch gathering for worship, prayer, and a season of fasting as they sought God’s answer to this question: “Lord, what is our next step?” This thriving community of faith was a multi-cultural church impacting this secular city with great favor from God. Luke describes it this way, “The Lord’s hand was with them, and a great number of people believed and turned to the Lord” (Acts 11:21).

These leaders were seeking God’s divine direction so that they would continue to be right in the midst of God’s redemptive mission. Every church and mission organization will come to a moment where they need divine insight collectively among their leaders. Insight on the critical decisions that will keep them vibrantly engaged in God’s unfolding mission. The leaders in Antioch received God’s answer through the Holy Spirit, who said, “Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.” God’s next step for them was to release their beloved mentor and coach, Barnabas, and his protégé named Saul to advance the mission. The decision ultimately changed the course of history. It made Antioch a launching pad for a whole new movement of churches spreading throughout Europe and eventually touching each of our lives today.

In 2017, we set a bold ten-year vision of being “400 Strong Churches by 2027.” Miraculously today, we are 568 churches in 15 states and 27 countries in just four years. One pastor commented to me, “I really thought this 400 churches goal was very aggressive.” And then asked, “Did you have any idea that this merger with Southeast would happen?” I responded, “No, at that time, Southeast was moving in a positive direction with a new leader and adequate funding.”

We believe this merger was a movement prompted by God and happened because of the courageous faith and radical generosity of the Converge MidAmerica Churches.”

So today, we find ourselves at another Antioch Moment. Over the next year will be calling our pastors and churches from MidAmerica, Southeast, and the Caribbean to pray and fast with us, as we consider the same question, “Lord, what is our next step?”

The difference between leaders and followers is that leaders are constantly seeking the next step. The strategic decisions that will keep their organization squarely in the center of God’s great redemptive work.

As we work hard to make this merger successful, raising the necessary financial support and developing the critical systems for starting and strengthening churches, we will continue to worship, pray, and fast together in humble dependence on God and wait for the Holy Spirit’s answer for our next step.

Pastors, will you lock arms with us as we worship, pray, and fast together, just as Barnabas, Simeon, Lucius, Manaen, and Saul did in seeking their Antioch Moment?

May our God allow us to be in the center of his great redemptive work taking place in our world.

As the COVID-19 pandemic swept across the globe, everyone recognized that this moment in history changed life as we know it. Many things came to a screeching halt. Our newly planted churches had to scramble and innovate to try and keep their young churches healthy and growing. We praise the Lord that most of our church plants survived and many of them even grew through the pandemic.

While we had a great number of prospective church planters in our pipeline heading into 2020, most of those interested in planting hit the brakes when the country went into lockdown. Prospective planters couldn't imagine how the process of gathering and starting a church could be accomplished in this "new reality." The amazing thing is that by the Summer of 2020, God stirred in the hearts of many to plant churches, even with an uncertain future. By 2021, we ramped

back up with assessing and deploying church planters. With the expansion of our district came new possibilities and we're thankful for another great year of multiplication.

Our ultimate responsibility as a movement is to come alongside these planters and help them fulfill the call God has placed on their lives. Each planting couple, each community they are reaching, and each strategy they envision is unique. We praise God for the sacrifice of each of these planters as they reach new Kingdom territory. If you know of potential church planters, send them our way so that we can help them discern this call.

Finally, thank you for being part of a movement that gives sacrificially so that these new works can reach their communities for Christ.



Why plant a church?

IN 2015, 4,000 CHURCHES WERE **PLANTED**. IN THE SAME YEAR, 3,700 CHURCHES **CLOSED THEIR DOORS**.

Five years later, our numbers aren't much better.

THE NUMBER OF CHURCHES **REPRODUCING** IS ONLY **7%** OF PROTESTANT CONGREGATIONS IN AMERICA.

31% OF MILLENNIALS HAVE NO RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION,

which is up from **22%** a decade ago. Similarly, **33%** of the portion of Generation Z that has reached adulthood have *no religious preference*.

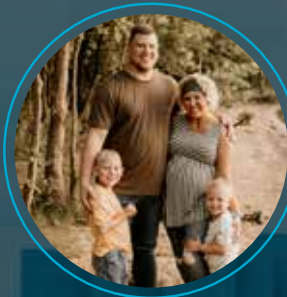
IN 2050, THE U.S. WILL FOR THE FIRST TIME IN ITS HISTORY HAVE **NO MAJORITY RACE**.

COVID and merger. These two words have marked the last two years in Church Strengthening. In regards to COVID, we were able to provide countless Zoom coaching calls to help each other figure out ministry in this new environment, encourage one another through the inevitable conflicts regarding when and how to open, and what “protocols” we would institute. Most of all, we prayed a lot! Because of COVID, we have instituted what we call Second Tuesday prayer. Once a month, we come together on a Zoom call from the Dominican Republic to Chicago to pray for each other, our communities and our churches. It has been an incredible blessing to see God encourage us through these times.

And then, there is the merger! What an amazing adventure that has been, as we have expanded our ministry to include the Southeast and Caribbean. I believe God has used this merger to help us be even more effective in Church Strengthening. I am blessed to have added three part-time

church strengthening directors. Andrew Ford in Michigan and Indiana, Kendal Anderson in Florida and Georgia and Gary Ricci in the Chicago Metro. Not only have these three pastors been incredibly valuable as “boots on the ground” in these places, they have helped me continue to strategize how we can serve our churches even more effectively moving forward. As we get bigger, we need to continue to get smaller, and our Together Groups are allowing us to do just that. Over 175 pastors participate all over our region in 16 different groups to encourage each other, learn with one another and dream about how they can see Christ’s Kingdom expanded in their particular area. We are even now talking about adding more groups, to connect more of our pastors. That is what Better Together is all about!

I can only imagine what the next two years will bring as we help see our churches become increasingly strong, healthy, gospel saturated and multiplying communities!

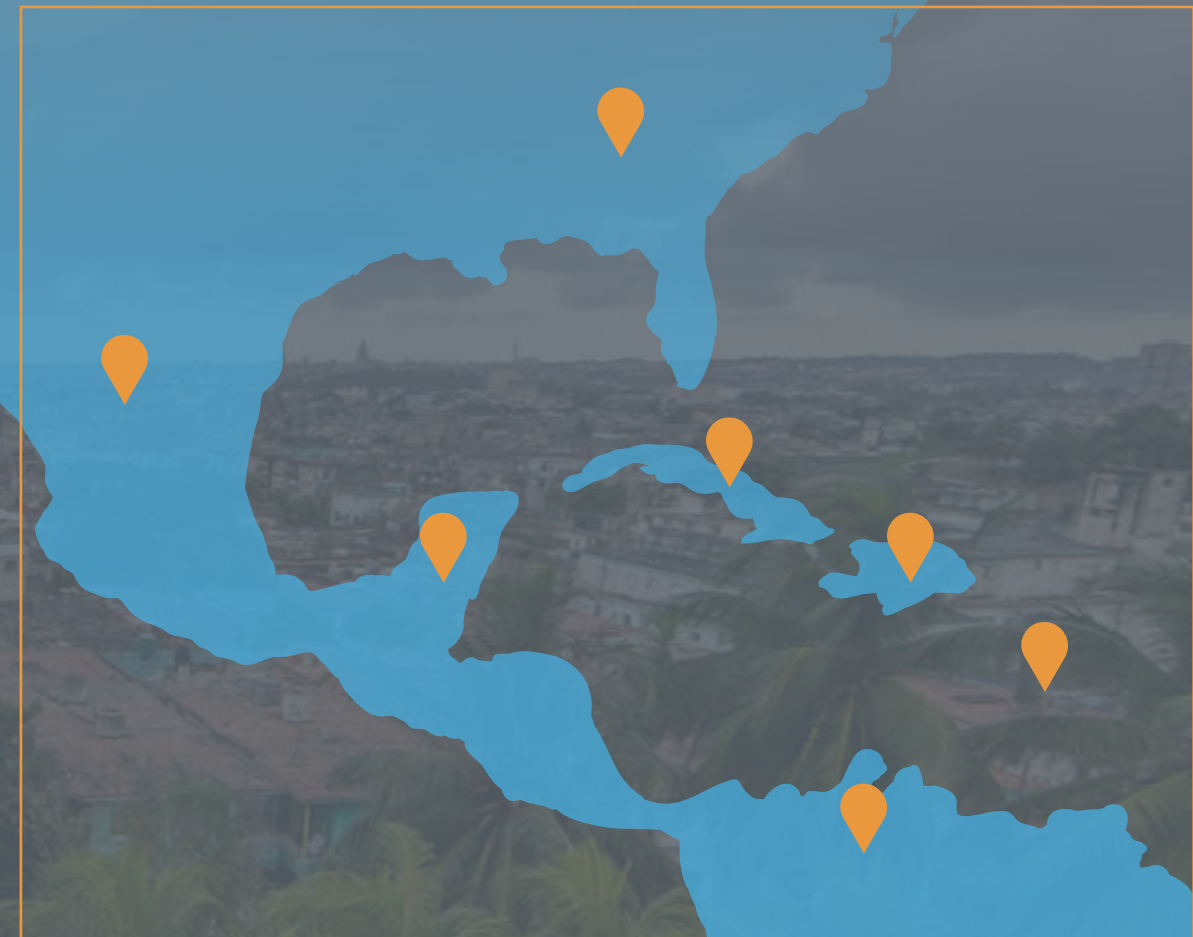

seek common grounds with each other as believers. Converge is a great name for our movement since we are coming together under the banner of the Cross to fulfill the Great Commandment and the Great Commission.

We are affiliating partner churches with this in mind. We look for churches who affirm our affirmation of faith which is based on our interpretation of the bible in addition to affirming our mission, vision and values. We believe in believer's baptism by immersion and for the congregation to have a voice in the governance of the local church so we ask these churches to do the same. We encourage them to participate with us in prayer and to use their time, talent and treasure to be involved in the life of our movement and our ministries. Our aim is for peace and unity in the essentials so we can align and converge together as a movement. As we learn and grow together in regards to the non-essentials, we help each other continue to better align to what the bible teaches because it is our supreme authority in all matters.

We are learning from The Timothy Initiative model of church planting to help us develop a contextualized plan of action to plant churches throughout the Caribbean. There are 34+ countries and 285 million people with Spanish, English, French and Dutch being the official working languages and 38 other spoken languages. From the house church to the major sanctuary and many in between models that fit the evangelistic planting passion of the movement.

Over the past two years the drive and passion to see the gospel advanced and a multiplication of disciples has resulted in church planting, church growth, church affiliations, kingdom conferences, and leadership seminars. With the gospel we are active in relief efforts throughout the Caribbean.

Converge was actively involved in the response of hurricane Dorian, as pastors were financially assisted, homes repaired by a disaster response team, containers of supplies and food were not just sent but

distributed to those impacted. Hot meals were served for over a year to those who did not have a home or kitchen. Most of all the love and practical application of the gospel was center stage as Converge churches from across America supported the Dorian response and the Converge Caribbean team served for over a year helping daily with the recovery. Due to Covid, we assisted and trained those leaders who had no knowledge of using social media, to continue to connect with their members and followers using zoom, Whatsapp, Facebook and YouTube.

The Caribbean is a microcosm of the world and presents many opportunities to plant churches, send missionaries and strengthen the many who are called and are yet to be properly equipped. Converge's focus is to reach, impact and serve those here, near and far. Those across the street and those across the world. The Caribbean is the "near" component of this facet of the movement.

God is alive and gives life to the church! Despite the difficult times that the church has been through in this pandemic, God is still at work. As a pastor and a leader, I realize that we are facing a new reality that is complicated and demands a number of changes and adjustments like never before in our generation. That being said, one thing must be clear. Our focus should be that our God is the same yesterday, today and tomorrow.

Casa de Oracion is a young church, pastored by Pastor Abram Delgado. In October of 2014, Iglesia Emanuel sent Pastor Abram along with 40 other members of the church on a journey to plant a new church in Round Lake, Illinois. They launched in March of 2015, and three years later, they were organized as a church. They didn't have a building, they rented for many years and moved a couple of times.

Through the generosity of Converge MidAmerica and many churches in the Lake County Together Group God, opened the way so that they could have a home of their own. On May 2, 2021, with the generosity of Converge MidAmerica and

many churches in the Lake County Together Group we made the dedication of the temple and this has become a great blessing for them and the community of Round Lake.

Mexico Mission Trip - Mexico is a country of great challenges on the subject of the gospel. The evangelical Christian church is less than 2% of its population. I have had the privilege of going on mission trips for more than 25 years to Mexico. We have worked with different missions, and as a result of this, we have planted two churches. One church is in the state of Michoacán. Every year we regularly take a team of people to work in this region.

For many years, we have talked and prayed with the leadership of our Converge MidAmerica district about the possibility of incorporating churches from outside the United States. This was a mutual feeling, for many years it was something that both sides desired. This year our prayer, and the beginning of affiliating partner churches, is starting to become a reality in Mexico. Through this partnership we can work together to plant more churches.

A new network of churches just joined in Haiti. They will be using the The Timothy Initiative to plant more churches.

As of July 2021, we have 2 TTI training centers. One just outside of Hinche and one in Cap-Haitian. Hinche TTI has 6 Paul's and about 65 Timothy's. They have been meeting for about 3 months and have about 12-15 new believers. Cap-Haitian TTI group has been meeting for about 7 months. There are about 50 Paul's involved in the program and about 400 Timothy's. There have been 324 salvations in the last 4 months and 49 baptisms.

"We are happy to join Converge and be a partner for the gospel. We have been working on the Timothy Initiative since March. Each week we get together with about 60 Timothys. Right now we have 15 people who have accepted Christ into their hearts."

SUPPORTING PASTORS' FAMILIES

We are devoted to caring for our pastors and their families.

A survey by Christianity Today reported that 90 percent of pastors' wives responded that they enjoy or are happy in their role as a pastor's wife. They also reported that "the single biggest problem facing pastors' wives is that of friendship. Fifty-six percent said they do not have close friends in the church. For some (28 percent), this is intentional."

To help with that reality, Converge MidAmerica offers the following support, mentoring and gatherings to encourage our pastors' wives in their unique role and to foster friendships outside of their church.

One-on-One Care: Mary Rohrmayer spends countless hours meeting one-on-one with many pastors' wives in our region. This is confidential and happens face-to-face, as well as phone calls, texting and emails.

Minister's Assistance Program (MAP): We are pleased to offer a counseling referral program to our pastors and their families. All full-time pastors, pastoral staff, spouses and children (college age and under) are eligible to receive nine sessions per calendar year with one of our qualified counselors. Each session requires a \$25 co-payment paid directly to the counselor by the pastor or family member. Converge MidAmerica pays \$70 per session to help offset the cost. In the past year, 84 pastors and families have utilized MAP, totaling \$57,500+ spent

towards mental health.

Leading & Loving It Groups: We offer help in getting connected with a wider range of pastors' wives via Leading and Loving It Ministries. This group helps pastors' wives connect via video calls with others that are in the same season of ministry.

Regional Area Dinners: We have special Regional Area Dinner gatherings with pastors and wives to create an opportunity to connect with other pastors' wives and for us to show love and appreciation for our ministry couples.

Pastors & Wives Retreat: Biennially, Converge MidAmerica greatly subsidizes the Pastors & Wives Retreat to provide a getaway in a beautiful setting for Converge ministry couples to rest, enjoy a top-notch speaker and connect with other couples from our region. We look forward to our upcoming retreat in November 2022 in Clearwater, FL.

Connect: At our triennial Connect Conference, we offer several breakout sessions just for pastors' wives. These are designed specifically to provide insight and encouragement for them as well as to make introductions with other pastors' wives to encourage new and ongoing relationships.

Monthly Newsletter: We send out a monthly email newsletter called Encouragement for Ministry Wives that goes out to over 400 pastors' wives.

FAQS

WHO IS CONVERGE MIDAMERICA?

Converge is a missional network of gospel driven churches, and we at Converge MidAmerica are one of 11 regional missional arms of our partner churches. For 167 years, we have served as 'state missionaries' who coordinated regional church planting and ethnic work. Today we are not only active in starting new churches, but are fully engaged in strengthening our partner churches through consulting, training and coaching. We are committed to starting and strengthening churches that will impact the world with the message of Jesus. We are fully engaged in supporting pastors' families as well as sponsoring vision trips to help our churches touch the world.

HOW DOES FUNDING WORK?

We live at the will and the funding of our partner churches, making us financially dependent on our churches to assist with the staffing and ministry programs we provide. Because of this, we recommend the following funding structures for our churches:

- 3% of church budget for Converge MidAmerica
- 1% of church budget for Converge National


The rationale for these percentages is that Converge National has access to all of the churches in Converge, while Converge MidAmerica only has access to the churches in our region. It is our hope that our churches will also generously support regional church planters, international missionaries, benevolence and world relief projects.

WHAT IS THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN CONVERGE NATIONAL AND CONVERGE MIDAMERICA?

Converge National has a national and international focus, deploying international missionaries and establishing national and international partnerships. Converge National provides international and national disaster relief programs, national chaplaincy program, Converge Retirement Plan and Converge Cornerstone Fund for church loans and investments.

Converge MidAmerica has a local and regional focus, deploying regional missionaries and church planters and establishing regional partnerships. Converge MidAmerica provides pastoral care, regional fundraising, pastoral placement and interim services, local church consulting and coaching and global vision trips for pastors and key leaders.
