

VISION UPDATE

At my first Connect Conference as President of Converge MidAmerica, I chose Psalm 118:25 as the theme verse for my report: "O Lord, save us! O LORD, grant us success!" For 37 years of ministry, this missional prayer has been on my lips. In commenting on the verse, C.H. Spurgeon wrote, "Let the church be built up: through the salvation of sinners may the number of the saints be increased; through the preservation of saints may the church be strengthened, continued, beautified, perfected." O LORD, grant us success! This missional prayer says, "O LORD, allow us to be part of your great redemptive work! Let us play a small part in your great missional cause!"

Interestingly, the Psalmist prays for salvation and success in the midst of a Psalm whose theme is thanksgiving for deliverance. The point is clear. Thankfulness for past victories will lead to a more desperate reliance on God's blessing for the future.

In 2011, I wrote the following:

"As a movement, we need not only to see this season of favor (2000-2010) as a blessing from God but also a call for more focused dependence on God as we seek his favor in this new decade. O LORD, grant us success as we seek to be in the midst of your great redemptive work!"

Can God help us plant 10-15 new churches a year?

Update Today: We have averaged at least one church per month (12) for the last ten years and reached 2 per month (24) at our peak.

Can God help us reach 100,000 people through our Easter Services?

Update Today: This number has been smashed with the merger of the Southeast/Caribbean. Our estimates are that over 150,000 people gather weekly under the Converge MSC banner.

Can God help us baptize 3,000 people a year throughout our churches?

Update Today: Although we have been terrible at collecting data from our churches, we believe this number is being smashed. Also, this year alone, two churches are reporting that they have baptized nearly 1000 people in their two churches during the first nine months of the year.

Can God help us expand our ethnic ministries beyond Chicago and into our other regions?

Update Today: We have an Ethiopian congregation in Indianapolis and Hispanic congregations in Tennessee! Who knew anything about the merger with the Southeast & Caribbean when that dream was declared?

Can God help us raise up the next generation of leaders to lead our churches?

Update Today: Our Converge Pastoral Placement Network has served us very well in aiding over two-thirds of our church's pastoral transitions.

Can God help us to better care for pastors and their families?

Update Today: Since 2010, we have invested over \$464,000 in care for our pastors and their families through the MAP program, the Pastoral Benevolence, and Special Pastoral Outings.

Can God help us reach 100% financial participation from our member churches?

Update Today: In 2010, 50% of the churches gave financially. We have averaged about 75% and, at times, reached 82% participation from our member churches. By God's grace, the next generation will need to strive to achieve this goal.

Can God help us top the \$1,000,000 mark in church support for our general ministry and church planting fund?

Update Today: In 2021, we topped the \$1,000,000 giving mark from our churches and have not returned since. Thanks to your generosity, Converge MSC leads the way in every financial category among Converge regions.

I ended that list of questions with these words:

"The answer is a resounding yes! I learned long ago that God's dreams are far bigger than ours because God loves those far from him much more than we do! So as a missional movement called Converge, let us unite our hearts, our talents, and our resources as we live out the gospel of Christ together".

Friends, in my heart, I am nothing but a missional mystic. I'm a leader just seeking to be in the middle of God's great redemptive work. We are all indebted to the courageous work done by my predecessor, Rev. Bernie Tanis, who restored this mission's spiritual, moral, and financial integrity, which set us up for the success we have experienced for the last 27 years. I have humbly tried, with great fear and trembling, to live up to those standards and maintain the spiritual, moral, and financial integrity that has granted us a level of success beyond our imagination.

So, this old missional mystic has only one prayer to pray for our new president-elect. "O Lord, save us! O LORD, grant us success!" O Lord, save us from ourselves, from our willfulness, our pride, our can-do spirit, our manipulative efforts, and even our false humility. O Lord, grant us success! Your success, true success, success that comes from the winds of your favor. O Lord, blow your strength and power on our meager efforts. May your heavenly wisdom guide us down the path of righteousness, and may the promises of your word help us to take leaps of faith as we seek advance your kingdom for your glory.

Tribute to Mary Rohrmayer

Jesus said, "I am among you as one who serves" (Luke 22:27).

Mary has been a model of dedication throughout our years in ministry together. She has always been willing to step in and take on necessary responsibilities, such as when one of my assistants suddenly resigned due to a family matter. During that time, Mary filled the role until I was able to hire a new assistant. Additionally, Mary and our friend Phyllis Howie worked together to share the church planting administration role for many years. They seamlessly managed all the details of our growing movement while also caring for the young church-planting couples and their families by sending surprise gifts and even church-planting bibs to welcome the newborn church planters into the world.

When I became president in 2010, many people thought Mary had become the Director of Ministry Wives. However, we already had a Director of Ministry Wives, Mrs. Shirley Smith. Instead, Mary transitioned out of the church planting department and received a stipend to be my traveling companion. This was necessary because, under IRS rules, we couldn't pay her travel expenses unless she had a staff role or position within the organization. Two years later, Mrs. Smith stepped down from her position, and we created a volunteer position that Mary graciously stepped into. We intentionally designed the Ministry to Pastor's Wives to focus less on programs and more on one-on-one mentoring and counseling, with various engagement options within a great group called "Loving and Leading It Ministries."

Over the last 26 years, when she has traveled with me, Mary has spent tens of thousands of hours listening to Church Planters and Pastor's Wives as they shared their joys and sorrows, highs and lows of ministry and family life.

Not only did Mary have a servant's spirit and a listening ear, but she was also a great fundraiser. She single-handedly raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for the MAP program (Minister's Assistance Program) from friends, family members, pastors, and churches over the last 14 years. Why? Because she is sold out to its absolute need! She felt the impact of the testimonies she received privately from ministry couples and pastors' wives who shared them with her. Even as a family, we experienced the healing power and blessing from the godly counselors in the MAP Program. Amid all this crazy traveling and ministry frenzy, Mary displayed an unstoppable resilience as she lovingly cared for her aging parents, gently guiding them through their health and aging issues until they each slipped into eternity with Jesus while under her care.

Mary, please receive these words of love as a tribute from a husband and a partner who could not have done any of what we have achieved these last 37 years of ministry without you.

In the ever-evolving landscape of church planting, we at Converge MSC have recognized the need for innovative approaches to meet the changing cultural dynamics of our communities. This shift has driven us to rethink and adapt our strategies, ensuring that we remain effective in our mission to plant healthy, thriving churches.

A significant focus of our efforts has been to cultivate church planters from within our own congregations. We understand that this "long game" approach—through internships and residencies—builds a strong foundation for future leaders who are deeply rooted in our values and mission. By investing in these emerging leaders early, we are positioning ourselves for sustainable growth and long-term impact.

Our Together Groups have become more integral than ever, actively participating in the recruitment and sending out of new church planters. These groups are not just communities of support but are now pivotal in identifying and encouraging individuals with the calling to plant new churches.

To scale our recruitment and assessment efforts, we have introduced Church Planting Catalysts across our region. These catalysts, comprised of dedicated Converge MSC pastors and planters, raise their own funds like missionaries and invest additional time into recruiting and mentoring future church planters. This initiative allows us to expand our reach and influence across diverse communities.

Thanks to the generosity of our Converge MSC churches, we continue to allocate significant financial resources to support these church planters. Our commitment to evaluate and refine our systems of recruitment, coaching, and deployment remains steadfast, all with the goal of planting healthy, life-giving churches that will impact generations to come.

I am often asked how I would describe Converge MSC. My first answer is always the same. We are a family of churches. So, what does being a family of churches really mean? The best way I can describe it is by using the phrase we use a lot — "No One Leads Alone". In other words, you can lead alone if you want in our movement, but we want it to be in spite of us, not because of us. If you aren't leading alone, that means you have relationships, partnerships, and friends that walk with you as you serve. I think it best describes what the Apostle Paul means in Romans 12:15 where we are called to "Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn."

We rejoice together often!! We have almost 300 pastors attending 16 regional gatherings of pastors called Together Groups that meet several times a year. These pastors not only simply meet, they share resources together, have fun together, pray together and dream of planting churches together. One of our pastors shared with me, "Not only does my Together Group provide me with a wealth of information and solutions to problems, I always have others to lean on and keep me from the discouraging and isolating struggles that often accompany ministry." Another shared, "Together Groups are a gift of grace that rescues pastors from isolation and provides a community that makes the joy multiplied and the sorrow tempered."

We rejoice in the literal hundreds of hours of coaching that have taken place for our pastors and churches. Historically, much of that coaching has happened from a staff perspective. Our goal is that every pastor is coaching someone, and every pastor is being coached by someone. Currently, we have approximately 40 of these one-on-one coaching relationships. Most are pastor-to-pastor. One pastor shared, "Receiving coaching on a monthly basis has been such a life-giving gift. My coach was always there to listen to what I was going through in

life and ministry, celebrating the encouraging things that God was doing, and also helping me discern and think through the challenges I was facing as well."

We rejoice each year when dozens of pastors, staff and families take advantage of our MAP program which provides counseling at a greatly reduced rate. This confidential resource has been a lifesaver for so many pastors and I hear all the time about what a blessing this is.

And we rejoice together when we have the privilege of helping churches with things like board training, conflict resolution, assessments, capital campaigns and pastoral placement, just to name a few. Only two years ago, we affiliated a church in Michigan that had about 20-30 people on a Sunday and no pastor. We helped them find a pastor, and in just one year, that church has a pastor, 80 Sunday morning attendees and several baptisms - some of whom have said yes to Jesus for the very first time! Another church in Florida was on the decline and celebrated their "best days" from at least a generation ago. That church is now seeing God move with a new vision, new pastor and a new commitment to the community of which they are a part. It is truly amazing. Each time we come alongside to encourage and help strengthen our churches, we do it with the posture of a family.

And finally, being a family means we grieve as a family. We've lost dear pastors and pastor's wives in this last season. We've seen other losses as well that break our hearts. I've been humbled as I have watched our pastors gather around those who are grieving, and I know it has meant the world to each one. That is what a family does; that is who we are, and that is who we will continue to strive to be as we relentlessly serve our churches and pastors.





WHO IS CONVERGE MSC?



HOW DOES FUNDING WORK?



We live at the will and the funding of our partner churches, making us financially dependent on our churches to assist with the staffing and ministry programs we provide. Because of this, we recommend the following funding structures for our churches:

- 3% of church budget for Converge MSC
- 1% of church budget for Converge National

The rationale for these percentages is that Converge National has access to all of the churches in Converge, while Converge MSC only has access to the churches in our region. It is our hope that our churches will also generously support regional church planters, international missionaries, benevolence and world relief projects.

WHAT IS THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN CONVERGE NATIONAL AND CONVERGE MSC?



Converge National has a national and international focus, deploying international missionaries and establishing national and international partnerships. Converge National provides international and national disaster relief programs, national chaplaincy program, Converge Retirement Plan and WIF for church loans and investments.

Converge MSC has a local and regional focus, deploying regional missionaries and church planters and establishing regional partnerships. Converge MSC provides pastoral care, regional fundraising, pastoral placement and interim services, local church consulting and coaching and global vision trips for pastors and key leaders.
